### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It has been a while since I have last contributed to 'Around the Courts' and a lot has happened both on and off the court during this time. A few things recently have caught my eye though...

#### Clendinnen Shield

Well done to Team Victoria at the recent Clendinnen Shield and Australian Closed Championships held at Burnie, Tasmania. Ably led by Ann-Louise Slee, the team conquered all other states and territories before narrowly going down to New South Wales in the final.

Many thanks to team manager Peter Brown and coach Ong Beng Teong for their tireless work before and during the week-long championships.

Whilst some may have questioned the relevance of the Shield in the current badminton landscape, I for one believe that the Shield still has a place in the Australian Badminton calendar and for a majority of Badminton players, to play in the Shield is the pinnacle of their Badminton "careers".

However, I do urge the powers-to-be to have a re-think on the overall structure of the Shield – it needs, and deserves, a bit of a "freshen up".

#### Loke Poh Wong – our first Aussie medalist in a World Championships

Congratulations to our former BV President, Loke Poh Wong, for his giant-killing run at the World Senior Badminton Championships recently held in Richmond, Canada.

Unseeded in the Mens Singles over 50 category, Loke Poh took on all-comers (including the number 2 seed from Denmark) but in the end the number 1 seed from Chinese Taipei was, according to the silver medallist himself, a slightly better player on the day.

Well done Loke Poh!!!

#### Review of the member affiliation system

Over the past few months the Board has been conducting a review of the membership affiliation system. The review was necessary in light of the concerns expressed by a significant number of our members.

As such we will be proposing a new system to be implemented in 2012, which will be Internet-based and separate the concepts of player registration and clubs/associations affiliation. Similar systems have been proven successful in other sports and we believe that such an overhaul will also benefit badminton in the medium to long term.

A consultation paper detailing the new system will be released shortly for public comments, and submitted for approval by members at the proposed Special General Meeting in November.

## Court Officials Committee

### Printing of Name on Clothing

It has come to the attention of the Court Officials Committee, many people are having names printed on the back of playing shirts, that are smaller than the BWF requirements. This is not a problem for everyday use, but you won't be able to wear these in an international tournament. Please refer to section 22 of the [BWF Handbook](#) for regulations on lettering and section 23 for advertising for complete information.

- 22.2.1 Letter shall be in capital letters of the Roman alphabet  
One single contrasting colour
- 22.2.3 Minimum Height of 6 Centimetres  
Maximum Height of 10 Centimetres
- 22.2.4 Lettering should be horizontal and placed near the top of the shirt
- 22.3 The player's name shall include the family name and if desired, the initials of the given name(s) or nickname
- 22.4 The country name shall be either the full country name in English or Olympic approved abbreviation
- 22.5 The sequence on the shirt from top to bottom shall be, player name, country name and advert (if present, see section 23 for more details)

### Referee Approval for Draws

Important reminder to event directors, all tournament draws MUST have your referee's approval BEFORE the draw is published. This is detailed in the Badminton Victoria admin pack, which is readily available from the Badminton Victoria office. Please take note of: Page 13 - Section 9 - 'Tournament and Event information' - Draw for Open and Junior Selection Tournaments

### 2011 BWF Senior World Championships

Congratulations to Loke Poh Wong for winning Australia's first World Championship medal by taking the Silver in the 50+ Men's Singles at the recent World Senior Championship.

The BWF World Senior Championship is held every two years, with previous host including Spain, Malaysia & Bulgaria. This is an individual championship with men's and women's singles and doubles, and mixed doubles events. The age categories are divided as follows: 35+, 40+, 45+, 50+, 55+, 60+ and 65+.

The 2011 World Senior Championship was held in Vancouver, Canada 21 -27 August. This is one of the largest participated World Senior Championships with 645 players from 37 countries including Asia, Europe, Oceania and Pan America.



Loke Poh was our only representative from Australia competing in the Championship. He defeated players from India, Canada, Japan, Denmark and Norway to reach the finals but missed out on the gold, going down to the top seed Taiwanese Wen Sung Chang 21-11, 21-14.

'I have never been so focused on any tournaments I have played in' said Loke Poh. 'It started with giving 100% in round one, as I did not want to be the first to be knocked out and that basically helped carried me through each round at a time. Also playing those early matches, as I was unseeded, did allow me to better adjust to the playing conditions of the competition courts which are totally different from the practices courts.'

Later in the year, BWF will announce the host for the 2013 World Senior Championships. The World Senior Championships is a Level 1 BWF tournament and each country is only allowed to enter 4 participants per event.

Team Victoria's next clash was a tough battle with Western Australia, which Team Victoria eventually won 7-6. Victoria fought back hard from 5-6 down, taking the last two mixed doubles matches to win the tie!

This was all leading up to what was going to be an epic final tie, with the undefeated Team Victoria facing an undefeated NSW. It was not to be Victoria's day, with the Shield heading to NSW. Commiserations to Team Victoria and well done to NSW on a fantastic effort by taking out the Clendinnen Shield for 2011!

## 2011 Australian Closed Championships

The 2011 Australian Closed Championships commenced after the Clendinnen Shield teams tournament and was a fiercely contested competition. Western Australia was the big winner with multiple titles heading west, but Victoria were able to pinch one title courtesy of Ann-Louise Slee.

Ann teamed up with Women's Singles winner, Michelle Zhang of New South Wales, to form an unstoppable force in the Women's Doubles. The pairing were ruthless in their quest for the title, needing only straight sets to win each match.

Their first match against fellow Victorians Tara Pilven and Tegan Berry ended 21-13 21-7, which was backed up with an equally dominate display against Ee-Jun Ban & Gerrelyn Gilco in which they won 21-11 21-10.

The final was the number 1 seeds, Ann & Michelle vs the number 2 seeds from South Australia, young guns Verdet Kessler & Talia Saunders. Verdet & Talia took the match to Ann & Michelle but ultimately went down in an entertaining contest 21-13 21-19.

Congratulations to Ann for a fantastic effort in taking home the Women's Doubles title and also for her magnificent work as captain of Team Victoria over the week long Championships!

## 2011 BWF Yonex World Championships

It was two from two for Australia on the opening day of the 2011 Yonex BWF World Championships in London, with both the Men's Doubles pairing of Smith/Warfe and Women's Doubles pairing Choo/Veeran racking up first round wins.

Leanne Choo and Renuga Veeran cruised through their opening match in style against Annys and Corvilain of Belgium. The Aussies jumped out to a commanding lead in the opening game to be ahead 11-2 at the break and they were never challenged, eventually winning 21-6 21-9.

Australia's top ranked men's doubles pair of Smith and Warfe were up against Scottish youngsters Campbell and Gilmour in their opening round match. While the Aussies did not have the match all their own way, they managed to keep their noses in front before pulling away towards the end of each set. Smith and Warfe moved onto face 2011 Australian Grand Prix Gold winners and 14th seeds Endo and Hayakawa from Japan while Choo and Veeran took on 11th seeds Vislova and Sorokina of Russia.

Aussie Men's Doubles pair Ross Smith and Glenn Warfe were knocked out by Endo / Hayakawa of Japan. The Australian's trailed from start to finish as the Japanese pair showed why they are ranked number 14 in the world, taking the match 21-9 21-11.

The Aussie girls gave 10th seeds Vislova & Sorokina a major scare taking the first set 22-20. From their on though the Russian pairing regained focus and took control of the match taking the 2nd and 3rd sets, 21-11 21-5.

It was a fantastic effort by the two Australian pairings to make it to the second round of the biggest Badminton tournament of the year and with both pairings now firmly entrenched the worlds top 50, we look forward to some big results in the near future!
